FREE THINGS TO DO IN THE VALLEY AND BEYOND





One of LA's largest regions, the **San Fernando Valley** is filled with free cultural attractions and dogfriendly parks. Then head to the nearby San Gabriel Valley for more hidden gems, spectacular mountain hikes, and a night with the stars.

Part 1 Studio City

Named for Mack Sennett Studios (opened in 1928, now called the CBS Studio Center), **Studio City** is famous for Sushi Row on Ventura Boulevard, numerous canyon parks, and historic residences - including one of the most famous houses in TV history.

The most populous neighborhood in the Valley, **Van Nuys** is home to Van Nuys Airport, the incredible Valley Relics Museum, the Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Reserve, and the landmark Van Nuys City Hall (built in 1932 as the Valley Municipal Building).

San Gabriel Mountains

Surrounded by the Angeles and San Bernardino National Forests, the **San Gabriel Mountains** were designated a U.S. National Monument by President Obama in 2014. You won't believe you're still in LA County when you make the trek to Echo Mountain, the Bridge to Nowhere, and the Mount Wilson Observatory.
