RECENTLY OPENED

Forgotten Fantasies are Unlocked at Luna Luna (DTLA)

December 2023 through Spring 2024

Grammy-winning artist, entrepreneur, and notable art collector Drake and his entertainment firm, DreamCrew, are behind this exciting opening that marks the world's first art amusement park - rescued and on view for the first time in DTLA. Thirty-six years ago, "Luna Luna" briefly introduced the world to a fantastical amusement park with rides and attractions by some of the most notable minds in arts & culture, including a carousel by Keith Haring, a forest pavilion by David Hockney, a mirrored funhouse by Salvador Dalí, and a ferris wheel by Jean-Michel Basquiat. This one-of-a-kind creation was lost to the world - until now.

The Egyptian Theatre

The Egyptian Theater reopened its doors on November 9th after undergoing a large renovation to restore the theatre. At 101 years old, the theatre is one of the oldest and most iconic in Los Angeles. Groove: Artists and Intaglio Prints, 1500 to Now at Hammer Museum (Westside) December 1, 2023-June 16, 2024

This exhibition surveys over five hundred years of intaglio prints drawn from the extensive collections of the UCLA Grunwald Center for the Graphic Arts at the Hammer Museum. The intaglio medium comprises engravings, etchings, drypoint, aquatint, and mezzotint, all of which involve the use of a copper or zinc plate which is incised, inked, and printed. These materials and techniques have remained more or less the same since the fifteenth century, with artists employing similar methods to convey a wide range of subjects and styles, from the intricate religious and mythological scenes of the 1500s to the formal experimentation of the 21st century. https://hammer.ucla.edu/exhibitions/2023/groove-artists-and-intaglio-prints-1500-now

One of the largest pastels made in the 18th century, Maurice Quentin de La Tour's Portrait of Gabriel Bernard de Rieux is an astonishing object. This focused exhibition highlights both La Tour's technical achievement and the global reality that financed and furnished de Rieux's world.



New Exhibits/Galleries/etc. at LACMA (*Mid-City*)

Imagined Fronts: The Great War and Global Media (December 3, 2023 – July 7, 2024) This exhibit explores how the media spectacle in which we live had origins in World War I and the burgeoning mediascape of posters, photography, cinema, illustrated newspapers, and ephemera that made it the first global media war.

LOS ANGELES INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (LAX)

New Dining and Retail Experiences at LAX West Gates at Tom Bradley International Terminal

Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) and Unibail-Rodamco-Westfield (URW) Airports, recently announced the opening of brand-new retail and restaurants inside the West Gates at Tom Bradley International Terminal. New dining options include the first airport restaurant from celebrity chef Guy Fieri's brand Chicken Guy!. Additional openings include BURGER KING®, Japanese noodle eatery Santouka, and opening soon is Spanish-style tapas restaurant Navarre. Guests can now shop the latest in LEGO® sets, travel essentials, iconic candies and chocolates, and top-rated luggage.

New Delta West Headhouse and Delta One Check-in and Ticketing Lobby

The first phase of the new Delta Sky Way at LAX opened to the public in April 2022, along with a new, premier Delta Sky Club. Delta unveiled nine new gates at Terminal 3 and a dedicated Delta One check-in opened on May 31, 2023. A joint \$2.3 billion investment with LAWA, the full Delta Sky Way project opened to the public in August 2023. Terminals 2 and 3 are now a consolidated, 1.2-million-square-foot, state-of-the-art, 27-gate complex,



featuring a quick airside connector to Tom Bradley International Terminal, eliminating the need to bus between terminals.

The West Headhouse, which features self-service kiosks for passengers to drop their bags and print boarding passes, provides another entry point to easily check in and get to security. At the Delta One check-in area, located on the lower arrivals level of Terminal 3, Delta One customers can access a private TSA screening lane and direct access to the Delta Sky Club.

LAX Budget Parking

Airside Link Between Terminals Opens at LAX

For the first time ever at LAX, ticketed passengers can now enjoy unrestricted terminal-to-terminal pedestrian access post-security. The new path of travel equals approximately 2-miles from Terminal 1 to Terminal 8, allowing airport guests to conveniently journey to connecting flights and an abundant collection of offerings including food and beverage vendors, shopping and entertainment experiences, lounges, children's play areas and pet relief stations, among others. The airside ink between terminals is one of many updates making LAX efficient, dependable and user-friendly.

The Automated People Mover at LAX

Expected 2024

The Automated People Mover (APM) is the centerpiece of LAX's \$5.5 billion Landside Access Modernization Program (LAMP) which will enhance the traveler experience, give guests time-certain access to terminals and provide the long-awaited connection to the regional transportation system. This project is a key portion of LAX's \$15 billion modernization program, considered the largest public works program in the history of the City of Los Angeles. The APM is an electric train system on a 2.25-mile elevated guideway with six stations total – three inside the Central Terminal Area (CTA) and three outside the CTA. Los Angeles International Airport broke ground on the APM project in March 2019 and anticipates that the system will be operational in 2024. During peak hours (9 a.m. to 11 p.m.), the APM will run nine trains, each with four cars and will be capable of carrying up to 50 passengers and their luggage, with a total of 200 passengers per train. Train speed will top out at 47 mph. The APM will be free for all users and operate 24/7.

TRANSPORTATION & INFRASTRUCTURE

Metro Regional Connector Transit Project

In June, Metro unveiled a newly constructed 1.9-mile rail link that provides riders a seamless journey from Azusa to Long Beach and from East Los Angeles to Santa Monica, through the Downtown Los Angeles core. The project includes three new underground stations and extends from the L Line (Gold) in Little Tokyo and Arts District communities to the A (Blue) and E (Expo) Lines at 7th Street/Metro Center Station. This project improves connections and makes it easier to ride across LA County without transferring lines.

The Purple (D Line) Extension Transit Project will add seven new stations and a reliable, high-speed connection between DTLA and the Westside, one of LA's busiest areas. Opening in three sections, Section 1 will include the Wilshire/La Brea Station, Wilshire/Fairfax Station and Wilshire/La Cienega Station - slated to open in 2024. https://www.metro.net/projects/connector-2/

Located at the corner of Fairfax and Third Street since 1934, the Market opened at what was then known as the Gilmore Ranch, where a dozen farmers and vendors parked their trucks on the corner to sell produce and other items from their tailgates. Boasting more Best Picture Oscar winners than any other studio, Columbia Pictures was founded by brothers Harry and Jack Cohn and best friend Joe Brandt on Jan. 10, 1924. Destination Crenshaw Expected 2024

Destination Crenshaw will be the largest public/private Black art program in the nation, stamping a 1.3-mile stretch of Crenshaw Boulevard with an infrastructure project that includes beautifully designed community spaces, landscaping, and newly planted trees, and 100 commissioned works by Black artists. While elevating Black culture, Destination Crenshaw will also boost the community through economic development, job creation and environmental healing. Key components will open this fall, with construction of the entire project slated for completion by the end of 2023.

Hollywoodland at the Academy Museum of Motion Pictures (Mid-City)

Hollywoodland will trace the history of filmmaking in Los Angeles back to its roots at the beginning of the 20th century, illustrating how and why the city became the world capital of cinema that it still is today. With a focus on the predominantly Jewish founders of the early Hollywood studio system, the exhibition will delve into how their personal narratives shaped the distinct characteristics of the movies their respective studios produced, and contextualize the role of antisemitism in motivating their visionary efforts. This immersive gallery will convey the evolving topography of Los Angeles along the timeline of the developing movie industry, allowing visitors to feel a tangible proximity to this rich history and encouraging further exploration of the city's landmarks upon departing the Academy Museum.
